**Hot Weather Procedures**

We have had a very hot week in school and the ice lollies have gone down a treat, this afternoon.

However, few parents have been concerned about access to water. Children always have access to their water bottles and we provide cups if any child has forgotten theirs. For most classes, water bottles are stored centrally, rather than on the children's desks. This is because if stored on desk-tops, water bottles often roll onto the floor and are a trip hazard. Plastic ones also often break, when trodden on. Storing in a central place/container also means that water bottles can be taken outside easily, for PE or playtime. The only time children will be asked to wait for their water bottle is if it is a few minutes before playtime or lunchtime or at a crucial part of teaching input. Then, water will be accessed shortly afterwards.
