School Vision

At St Paul's, we will nurture and inspire all children to enjoy a life-long journey of discovery and friendship. Through God's love and Jesus' teachings, our school community will support each child to flourish as curious, compassionate and resilient citizens with a love of learning.

In order to fulfil this Vision, the Local Governing Board have agreed the following policy.

Introduction

At St Paul's CE Primary School, we expect all children to wear school uniform and be of smart appearance. Our uniform does much to engender pride in the school, as well as creating a sense of identity and belonging. Wearing school uniform also gives all children a greater sense of equality: no one is singled out for not having the latest designer brands. The uniform is also comfortable, practical, hard-wearing and cost effective. In developing this policy the school is mindful of DfE guidance: *Developing school uniform policy (updated 7th Nov 2025)*, pertaining to the limiting of more expensive items (with the school logo) in order to make uniform more affordable. This policy aims to comply with obligations under the *Human Rights Act 1998* and the *Equality Act 2010*.

Please ensure that all items of clothing are clearly marked with your child's name.

Main Uniform Expectations

- Blue sweatshirt, cardigan or Y6 fleece ***with the school logo***
- Blue polo shirt
- Grey school skirt or pinafore
- Grey school trousers or school shorts (not tight-fitting)
- Sensible black school shoes with plain white, grey or black socks.

PE Uniform

- Blue, quarter-zip sports top, ***with the school logo***
- House-colour T-shirt
- Black shorts
- Black plimsolls (optional but useful for indoor PE)
- Plain, black tracksuit bottoms (no large logos, badges or stripes)
- Trainers for outdoor P.E. (predominantly white or black uppers)

For swimming lessons (Year 5 & 6) children should have swimming trunks (no Bermuda style shorts) or a plain 1-piece swimming costume. Swimming hats may also be worn.

Jewellery/ Watches

No jewellery is permitted except for simple, plain stud earrings in pierced ears. We ask that no earrings are worn on PE days (please see Partnership Books.) If deciding to have ears pierced, the start of the summer holiday is the best time, as earrings can be taken out by the time children return to school. An inexpensive wristwatch may be worn.

Hair Styles

These should be neat and tidy with long hair tied back to aid concentration and prevent the spread of head lice. Hair should be of a natural colour with no close shaving or sharp contrasts in length. Large and elaborate hair accessories should not be worn, and any simple bobbles, clips and hair bands should complement school colours. (Blue, black or blue gingham.)

Seasonal Wear

In Winter, black or grey tights may be worn and children should have a school or similar coat. After Easter, blue gingham dresses may be worn. White ankle socks with a blue gingham trim are also permitted. A sun hat is recommended. Please note that after **October half term**, winter uniform should be worn: no summer dresses. This is to ensure that the children are warm enough during playtimes and outdoor learning opportunities.

Cultural or Religious Considerations

Uniform expectations may be modified for religious or cultural reasons. Please see the Headteacher.

Bags and Rucksacks

Children should have a school book bag in Years R- Y4. In Year 5 and Year 6, a school rucksack may be purchased instead. Due to limited cloak room space, no other school bags are permitted.

Sustainability and Value

A parent focus group reported that even though the polo shirt (with the school logo) was slightly more expensive, it was harder-wearing, less liable to staining and dried far quicker than supermarket, plain versions.

Multiple suppliers are available for almost all items. Where there is only a single supplier (sports ¼ - zip top), the school offers a whole-school order, at a reduced price. Regular second-hand uniform sales, also take place.

Many non-logo items can be purchased, inexpensively, from supermarkets or on-line.
